Disparity Study: General Overview

What is a Disparity Study?

Disparity studies examine whether minority and women-owned businesses are receiving an equitable share of the jurisdiction or agency contracting dollars, based on the availability of such firms.

These studies, which can take between 12-24 months, can help government agencies identify barriers for MBEs and WBES in the contracting process and examine whether programs are needed to assist these firms in government contracting and purchasing.

Disparity Calculation Example



"In this simplified hypothetical example, the disparity index of 0.67 indicates a disparity between African American construction firms and other firms exists. As a general rule of thumb, a disparity of less than 0.80 (or 80 if expressed on a scale that multiplies the disparity index by 100) indicates a substantial disparity."

Disparity Study RFP: Goals and Objectives

Goal: To determine whether a statistical disparity exists in the utilization of minority- and women-owned business enterprises in the District's contracting and procurement activities based on four years (FY17- FY20) of historical data.

Objectives

- A complete, statistically sound, and legally defensible analysis the District can rely on to enforce current requirements and/or create new requirements in connection with the participation of minority- and women-owned businesses (MBE/WBEs) in all District contracting and procurement processes
- Reliable and accurate data that will assist the District in determining the extent to which the District's procurements should be subject to a race and/or gender conscious remedial program; and
- Assessment of the need for race- and/or gender-conscious procurement practices and, if applicable, recommendations for how to design such a program

Disparity Study RFP: Set-Aside

Set-Aside for CBEs and Joint Ventures

- Keeping with our commitment to maximize opportunities for District CBEs, this solicitation is a set-aside for Certified Business Enterprises (CBEs) or Joint Ventures (JVs) that include a CBE as a partner. That means offerors must be submitted by a CBE or a JV.
- A Joint Venture is an association of two or more businesses temporarily formed to carry out a single business activity or project for profit in which they combine their property, capital, efforts, skill, and knowledge.
- The association, which is limited in scope and duration, must be certified by DSLBD. To apply for certification of a JV, please go to <u>https://dslbd.dc.gov/service/certify-joint-venture</u>.
